	Pages of the child passport: identity and visa
	If it's a renewal: current DCEM
	Birth certificate of the child with the filiation
	3 recent ID photos taken in France (following the 35 mm x 45 mm format – ISO/IEC 19794 – $5:2005$ standard)
	For school aged children: certificate of enrolment of the current year
	Current residence permit proving the legality of the stay of one of the parents (with up-to-date address):
	Visa with the copy of the first and last stamp of entry in France/Schengen Area or residence card o If it's a long stay visa equivalent to a residence permit (VLS-TS), add: the proof of its online validation (« Confirmation de la validation de l'enregistrement de votre visa long séjour valant titre de séjour »)
	A proof of address dated less than 3 months in your name:
	Electricity, gas, water, phone or Internet bill; home insurance certificate (« Attestation d'assurance habitation »); rental contract or receipt/bill (if dated less than 3 months); « Taxe d'habitation » (if dated less than 3 months); hotel attestation and last bill (dated less than one month).
	 If you are accommodated by someone: « Attestation d'hébergement » form filled in and signed by the person accommodating you; copy of the valid ID of this person (French/European ID or French residence permit; if it's a residence permit card the address must be up to date); A recent proof of address (less than 6 months) in this person's name
	If the parents have different nationality, proof of the child's nationality
	If one of the parents lives abroad, court ruling showing the other parent authorizes the child to stay in France
	In case of separation or divorce, French court ruling certifying the parental authority
